Eligibility Requirements

General Guidelines

1. You must have an active customer account with HMLP.
2. The electric account must be in good standing with no overdue bills.
3. The rebate item must be installed at the account location.
4. Applications must be submitted in the same calendar year as the purchase (by 12/31 of the current year) OR three (3) months from the date of purchase.
5. Claimable rebate amounts reset annually on January 1. Please refer to individual programs to see their annual and lifetime payout limits.
6. Rebates that are \$500 or less will be issued as a credit on your HMLP electric account. Rebates greater than \$500 will be issued as a refund check from the Town of Hingham.
7. HMLP may request additional information or reject rebate applications at any time.
8. HMLP reserves the right to adjust or conclude a rebate program at any time.

Important Things to Note

- If you have natural gas as the primary heating fuel in your home, you are eligible to use the Mass Save incentive program for heat pumps, weatherization, and applicable appliances. If you opt to use the Mass Save program, you are not eligible for HMLP's corresponding rebates. Please refer to www.MassSave.com for their guidelines.
- The electric vehicle rebate is only applicable to EV chargers that are qualified for the Connected Homes program. Please see www.nextzero.org/Hingham to see which chargers qualify.
- The Connected Homes Demand Response program issues credits on a quarterly basis to participating customers. Customers receive an incentive per month of participation. Credits will be visible on the electric bill at the end of the following quarter.

Landlords & Renters

Landlords can apply on behalf of tenant accounts for rental buildings. The landlord(s) and/or tenant(s) can inquire about this guideline from HMLP at any time. HMLP will require the signature of both the building owner and the HMLP account owner on the application if they are separate. Any desired or necessary negotiations are to be worked out between the landlord(s) and tenant(s).

Planning for Home Improvements

For customers interested in becoming more efficient over time, pay attention to when you may need to replace old appliances, heating and cooling equipment, or make other large changes to your building. You can [download a planner](#) from the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center (MassCEC) to start mapping when and how to maximize opportunities. Make a plan that works for you based on your own timeline and needs.
